

I. Strategic Planning-related Research

Carried out in 2010–15 quinquennium



Projects commissioned 2012–13 To support the strategic-planning process

SUMMARY

- Five major studies completed
- Drew on a total of 42,150 interviews or completed questionnaires from around the world
- Methodologies: both quantitative and qualitative (though mostly the former)
- One major study left unfinished

Projects 2012-2013

- 1. Global Church Member Survey (GCMS)
- Implemented on six continents, in nine divisions, n = 26,343
- 2. Pastor's Survey
- Implemented in all 13 divisions, 116 unions (93%), and 424 conferences and missions (71%), n= 4,260
- 3. Adventist Connectedness Study (Millennials Survey)
- Graduates of Adventist universities (in NAD only), n = 1,153

Projects 2012-2013

4. Leaving the Church

- Qualitative study: interviews with former Adventists conducted in eight divisions, n = 925
- 5. Study of tithing and stewardship behaviors
- Included quantitative survey data, and analysis of actual tithe receipts and demographic data
- Implemented in five conferences on five continents
- For quantitative portion, n = 9,003

Projects 2012-2013

- 6. Surveys of school and college teachers, and hospital employees
- It proved impossible to make significant headway

- 7. One other more minor study:
- Church Leader Survey in all 13 divisions
- Completed, but not in time for results to be incorporated into the 2015–20 strategic plan
- Survey conducted in 2012–2014, n = 560

Reach the World

- All these research projects were carried out to inform the global strategic-planning process.
- The results of the five major studies were processed at the strategic planning retreat at Ouray, Colorado, in August 2013
- The outcome was *Reach the World*

Carried out in 2016–2020 quinquennium



Commissioned by FPWG for 2016–2023 To support the strategic-planning process

SUMMARY

- 1. Institutional workers' worldwide
- Building on the work begun in 2012–2013
- Seven years allocated: final reports to be submitted 2023
- Thus far: finished surveying teachers in SPD, NAD, TED;
 Surveys taking place of media centers worldwide and of all institutions in SAD


SUMMARY

- > Two new major studies commissioned and completed
- 2. Global Church Member Survey: implemented in all thirteen divisions, n = 63,756
- 3. Church Leader Survey: implemented in all thirteen divisions and in MENA, n = 440

Presenting to a convocation of local area churches in Spokane






I Will Go

IV. Strategic Planning-related Research

To be carried out in 2016–2020 quinquennium



1. Global Church-Member Survey III

- We want to survey all thirteen divisions plus CHUM again
- Add MENA?
- Goal: equal or greater number of completed surveys than in 2018 (n = 63,756)
- To be implemented by teams in each division—the likely leaders of those teams will be joining us later

2. Church Leaders' Survey

- To be implemented by ASTR
- Concept: to use divisions' Year-End Meetings againbut is there a better way?
- Goal: to increase the number of valid responses to more than 500

3. Institutional Workers' Survey

- Complete the work already begun
- Ideally should cover *all types of* institutions: not just schools or media centers but colleges, hospitals, publishing houses, health-food factories
- Will not be possible to survey *all* institutions but aim is to get a representative sample of each sector
- One team implementing: Avondale University College, led by Dr. Robert McIver

4. Pastors' Survey

- This is provisional: funding is uncertain
- FPWG identified need of a pastors' survey at Spokane; supported by current administration
- No survey in 2015–20 quinquennium; if not done this time, it would mean 15 years between surveys
- Yet this is the key workforce in the entire church
- If it goes ahead, it will probably be implemented by one team (identity to be determined by FPWG)
