# **Executive Summary**

### 1.1 Brief description of the project

The project presented in this report was designed to be a part of the 2017 Church Member Global Survey and to provide relevant data for the Inter-European Division of the Seventh Day Adventist Church regarding its members' faith and convictions, spiritual life related behaviors and habits, in-group and out-group attitudes that translate into community oriented and mission oriented behaviors and initiatives.

### 1.2 Geographical scope/Target audience(s)

The targeted population for the study consists of the Seventh Day Adventist Church members from the Inter-European Division, organized in 11 Unions on the territory of 12 countries. The size of the targeted population was 177914 people according to 2016 reports.

The response rate for CMS 2017 survey was 77.30% of the projected sample of 5000 people, meaning that all data presented in this report has been gathered from 3865 participants.

### 1.3 Purpose/objectives of the proposed research

The study has aimed to reach the following research objectives:

- 1. To explore the faith-related beliefs of the SDA members of EUD (corresponding to Reach up with God portion of Reach the World 2015-2020);
- 2. To analyze the attitudes towards the church in general and the local communities (corresponding to Reach in with God portion of Reach the World 2015-2020);
- To explore the mission and evangelism related attitudes and behaviors of EUD members (corresponding to Reach out with God portion of Reach the World 2015-2020);
- 4. To investigate the habits and lifestyle choices of the SDA members of EUD that are relevant for their religious and spiritual life;
- 5. To identify common trends and differences among the culturally different areas of EUD regarding members' beliefs, attitudes and behaviors.

## 1.4 Methodology

The research has followed a quantitative approach: operator assisted survey based on the translated and culturally adapted version of 2017 Church Member Survey.

The research sample has been selected through a sequential / cluster method, designed to be representative for the target population for age, gender, ethnic groups and other relevant demographic variables. The number of participants to the study and the corresponding number of churches has been calculated based on a proportional layered model in order to ensure a better representativeness of the entire sample

## 1.5 Key Findings

 With an average age of 51.53 the church in the Inter-European Division is aging, following the trend of the European population, with low birth rates and increased life expectancy.



- 31,80% of participants reported having completed a level of higher education (college, graduate school or higher), with 46.1% for the 21-35 years old age group. The figures are comparable to the ones specific for UE.
- Of all the participants, 2486 (64.3%) never attended an Adventist school. 2.1% have spent 10 or more years in an Adventist institution. The Romanian and the North German samples have spent significantly fewer years on average than most of the other samples, while the Italian and the Czecho-Slovakian samples reported significantly more years spent in Adventist schools (p<0.05).
- The household size in EUD varies between 1 and 22, with a median of 3 and a mean of 3.12 members residing together. The mode value for this item is 2, which, considering the age demographics, corresponds to a middle aged or elderly couple (with or without adult children).
- The large majority of the respondents (73.92%) was married at the time of the study while 12.91% were single. 6.21% of the participants were widowed and 5.13% divorced. The divorce rate is significantly smaller than the one of the general population.
- 76.6% of the respondents reported having children (36.8% parents with at least one child or teenager living at home and 37.5% parents of adult children). The median number of children in the EUD sample is 2, with a mean of 2.26 and a standard deviation of 1.45. The mean value for the 21-25 year-old group is 1.7, similar to that of the EU.
- The percentage of children who are still being raised in the SDA faith and / remain Adventists as adults is significantly smaller than the number of children born to Adventist parents. The median value was 2, while the mean was 1.99, a significantly lower number compared to the number of children reported above (t(2329)=17.69 p<0.01)</li>
- The year of baptism ranges between 1931 and 2017, with a spike during the postcommunist years. The phenomenon is present in the Romanian, Czecho-Slovakian and Bulgarian Unions, countries where the fall of Communist regimes brought freedom of speech and an increased interest in religion within the population.
- The age at baptism varies between 10 and 84, with a median value of 20 and a mean of 25.21. Most participants to the study (75.9%) have been baptized (for the first / only time) in young adulthood.
- 67.4% of the participants hold an office at their local church. This imbalance between
  participants who hold an office and members with no particular position within the local
  church is maintained for all samples at Union level. Considering that the data has been
  collected through random sampling at local church level, during the Sabbath, it may be
  a fact that most people present during Sabbath, especially in small churches, are the
  ones involved with an office or a mission.
- Most participants reported having positive experiences during childhood. This may be a
  bias or a fact that supports a hypothesis that needs to be tested: Positive religion –
  related experiences during childhood in the family facilitate the connection to the
  church in adult years.
- There are some cultural differences among different groups of participants regarding the decision making processes during teenage years. For all tested situations, the Bulgarian sample has reported the highest scores for decision made by the teenager himself, while the Czecho-Slovakian sample has the lowest scores for the same type of



answer. Also, teenagers report having made more decisions by themselves compared to other age groups, which may signal a trend.

- The most frequent religious activities and habits are: attending church services (91.09%), attending Sabbath School (87.56%), personal prayer (92.27%), personal devotions (77.78%) and reading the Bible (76.57%). Younger participants are more often involved in religious activities with others (non-family), while older respondents participate more often in personal religious activities.
- The level of participation in programs and projects initiated by the church is relatively low (below 25% for any of them, with a participation rate of 5.7% for Reach the World Strategic Plan 2015 2020).
- The personal and emotional experiences with the church are mostly positive. There are significant differences among Unions regarding almost all items on this topic. For example, that are significant differences among Unions regarding the following statement: Although I am religious, it does not affect my daily life ((9)= 851.336 p<0.01). The Romanian sample has the highest scores, while the North German sample the lowest.</p>
- The writings of Ellen G White are highly accessible all across the Unions of EUD.
- As a tendency, the majority of participants believe that all efforts of the church and their personal involvement needs to increase.
- 63.9% of the participants are satisfied and very satisfied with their local church. The Swiss sample has reported the highest level of satisfaction, while the Italian scored the lowest to the same item. The seniors reported the highest level of satisfaction with the local church among age groups.
- 84.8% participants believe that they will most likely be attending a Seventh-day Adventist Church for the rest of their life.
- 88.46% of participants declare themselves to be happy. There are significant differences among EUD Union samples regarding their level of life satisfaction (F(9,3501)=22.95 p<0,01). Post hoc analyses have shown that the Czecho-Slovakian Union registered the lowest scores compared to the other samples. There are significant differences among EUD Union samples regarding their level of life satisfaction (F(3,3440)=16.55 p<0,01). Post hoc analyses have shown that the seniors registered the highest scores compared to the other groups.
- Seniors have a keener sense of spiritual growth, while teenagers express more doubt and confusion.
- The vast majority of participants show consensus on the Adventist relevant beliefs.
   Teenagers are the most uncertain of the age groups.
- Only 21.2% of participants are vegetarian and vegan. The largest percentages are registered in the Austrian, Swiss and Portuguese samples.
- Of all participants, 12% have used alcohol and 1.1% had used tobacco during the previous 12 months. The percentage is larger among teenagers.



## Introduction

### 1.6 Background and previous research in Europe

Following five global researches carried out between 2011-2013, a series of major issues have emerged as relevant problems for the Adventist community worldwide. Each of those issue falls into one of the following categories:

- 1. Beliefs, convictions and their behavioral correspondents: faith and religious related habits, personal choices, self-evaluations of spiritual life, lifestyle, education and knowledge;
- 2. Attitudes towards members of the church and involvement in the local SDA community;
- 3. Attitudes towards the out-group and behaviors regarding prosocial involvement and dissemination of SDA core values and beliefs

Each of these dimensions is supported by one or several departments of the Church's administration at all levels and has a direct connection to the development of the individual and the community.

 Beliefs, convictions and their behavioral correspondents: faith and religious related habits, personal choices, self-evaluations of spiritual life, lifestyle, education and knowledge;

The first research area approaches devotional and spiritual learning habits as means to cultivate and maintain faith and an active spiritual life.

According to previous studies, there is a decline in most divisions of the SDA Church of personal commitment to participation in vital personal, familial, and corporate spiritual practices - especially in personal Bible study and family worship. Yet frequent, regular personal and familial prayer, Bible study, and worship are foundations of the church, and ought to be strongly encouraged. (Reach the World. Strategic Plan 2015-2020)

The situation is similar to the broader context of religious life in USA, where, though declining, habits like prayer and scripture study are still common among members of various churches. "More than half (55%) of Americans say they pray every day, according to a 2014 Pew Research Centre survey, while 21% say they pray weekly or monthly and 23% say they seldom or never pray. Even among those who are religiously unaffiliated, 20% say they pray daily. Women (64%) are more likely than men (46%) to pray every day. And Americans ages 65 and older are far more likely than adults under 30 to say they pray daily (65% vs. 41%). A quarter of American adults (24%) say they participate in prayer and Scripture study groups or other types of religious education at least once a week. Although the share of Americans who identify with a religion has been shrinking, the percentage of religiously affiliated adults who report participation in prayer groups, scripture study groups or religious education programs is somewhat higher today than it was in 2007 (30% vs. 27%)." (Pew Research Centre, 2015)

When it comes to beliefs in the landmark SDA doctrines, there is a slight decline in conviction regarding the imminence of Christ's second coming, the Sanctuary doctrine, and Creation as described in Scripture. The uncertainty and dissension rates are low and varies across world zones. Yet, the belief in Ellen White's prophetic gift is very strong all around the world even though the proportion of church members who report regularly reading her writings is very low. The reasons for these results vary according to geographic areas. While western countries might motivate the lack of reading by the little time for lecture and disinterest, other



parts of the world are affected by problems with distribution and illiteracy. (Reach the World. Strategic Plan 2015-2020)

Secular thinking and entertainment, as reasons for a decrease in the vitality of the spiritual life of SDA members are especially present in the Western world, but increasingly in other parts of the world as well. At a different level, the trend is especially visible in Europe, where secularization is the number one reason for religious decline, though there are major differences between the western and the eastern countries of the continent. (Voas & Doebler, 2011). Other parts of the world are facing different issues as: belief that witches' powers are real, evil spirits have power even over Christians or accept that spirits of the dead can communicate with and control the living.

2. Attitudes towards members of the church and involvement in the local SDA community;

The importance of the religious community for the individual and for the society is supported by the fact that the relationships among their members are often stronger and more stable than any other type of community due to the internalization of beliefs and to shared values. Any religious community, including the Seventh-Day-Adventists presents in different degrees these defining characteristics (Niculiță, 2011):

- free choice: the possibility to choose the way to communicate with God and whether or not to adhere to the community and its beliefs;
- dimension and its impact on relationships: the larger the community, the lower level of direct interactions and the higher level of organization and bureaucracy. Yet, many religious communities still manage to preserve the characteristics of small groups: high level of connections, high cohesion, high social activism;
- stability: the religious communities are functioning around a small group of active members that keep their membership for a long time and are in charge of transmitting the values and specific religious beliefs. There kinds of communities prove to be extremely resilient during political and social conflicts or dictatorships. They represent a source of emotional, spiritual and even physical balance and refuge;
- the nature and strength of interpersonal relationships among members: Religious communities present a familial and even paternal - like type of cohesion. Most members consider themselves as brothers and sisters, coming to kinship through baptism.

All these characteristics are relevant for the SDA community related research topics. For example, the cohesion and resilience of a community is based on member care. According to *Reach the World. Strategic Plan 2015-2020*, "many local churches lack robust mechanisms for member care, especially for those who are at risk of leaving the church. While the number of church members has grown significantly over the past fifty years, in the same period, four out of ten of all members have left. There is an evident need for comprehensive member-care strategies to enhance the experience in the local church family and thus improve membership retention patterns".

The objectives of improving member care and preserving values can only be reached through systematic education efforts. Sabbath School is one of the main such approaches and proves to be positively appreciated and attended. When it comes to other education domains, such as formal education, the situation is less positive. Less than half of all Seventh-day Adventists worldwide have experienced any denominational education and



even among pastors the rate is low. This may have a large impact on the beliefs and acceptance of SDA doctrines. (Reach the World. Strategic Plan 2015-2020)

One of the issues worth researching is the place of religion in curriculum. Whether religious education is confessional or non-confessional, religion is always taught as a separate subject, at least in European countries. (Pepin, 2009). The approach is similar in many countries around the world and collides with the principle of integrating faith and teaching.

An indicator of the support of SDA church and local communities is the tithe which, while increasing in total value, shows a decrease in faithfulness among members. As an overall indicator, it relates more to the wellbeing of the church but as an individual measurement, tithe has more to do with the financial involvement in the SDA community and faithfulness.

3. Attitudes towards the out-group and behaviors regarding prosocial involvement and dissemination of SDA core values and beliefs

Reaching out to the community and society at large has two main components: prosocial and evangelistic. There is little data regarding the first one. The evangelistic efforts, though, are meeting with new opportunities and challenges.

Adventist media, correlated with the extensive spread of mobile devices and other gadgets provides extraordinary opportunities both for widening evangelism and witness and for responding to the issues identified above: promoting and enriching Bible study, disseminating Ellen White's writings, and energizing and equipping church members for service. (Reach the World. Strategic Plan 2015-2020) Adventist presence online is strong yet, access and quality ratings remain a problem among SDA members, especially young ones.

When it comes to SDA mission, two objectives are especially challenging and constitute the focus of large evangelistic projects:

- the countries of the "10/40 Window"—the heartland of the great world religions, which in many cases face economic and/ or political challenges and have restrictions on religious liberty;
- Adventist presence and influence in large urban areas, especially in North Africa, Europe, the Middle East, and Asia.

Part of the second evangelistic effort, a study carried out in 2014-2015 in Bucharest on a representative sample of 451 non-Adventist participants has proved that only 14% of respondents listen to Voice of Hope Radio and 20.84% have watched at least once Hope Channel's TV programs. 30.14 % declare a clearly positive attitude towards SDA members, while 60% consider themselves neutral towards the same target. Only 4% of the participants to the study has ever bought some religious literature and, if they have been offered some, 36% has read it, while 21.33 % has thrown it away and 14% has refused it. The most pessimistic result of the study has been the one regarding religious interest. Only 4.44% of the participants have stated that they are interested and looking for a religion to answer their questions, while 77.55% are not interested in another religion or any religion at all. (Conferința Muntenia a Bisericii Adventiste de Ziua a Şaptea din România, 2013).

#### Religious trends and SDA community in Europe

A comparison between European and other world regions on religious matters is a difficult endeavor considering historical and sociological factors, as well as the extreme variety of



denominations and practices. Anthropological, ethnographical and even historical studies are more common but empirical research has been quite American-centric, encouraged by the conventional wisdom that the United States is an outlier of religiosity in the developed world, and, more pragmatically, by the availability of survey data. (Brenner, 2016).

An analysis of the situation of religious practices and affiliations across Europe has been marked by the large trend of secularization. Some studies suggest that the process is not a homogenous one as religious decline is mainly occurring in Catholic European countries and has effectively ceased among post-1945 birth cohorts in six Northwestern European societies where secularization began early. Considering factors as migration, different fertility rates and historical changes, it is possible that, despite the grim prognostics, Western Europe or, at least, some parts of it, may be more religious at the end of the 21st century than at its beginning. (Kaufmann, 2012; Requena & Stanek, 2013).

The problem of religious education in Europe is highly politicized and debated, especially in some countries where the secularization process is not fully established or the ethnic religious issues are particularly prominent. (Smyth, Lyons & Darmody, 2013) As a general policy, European Parliamentary Assembly invited member states 'to avoid any conflict between state-promoted education about religion and the religious faith of families, in order to respect the free decision of families in this very sensitive matter'. (Pepin, 2009)

**Valuegenesis Europe** has been one of the largest research projects on a European SDA population of young people. Since it has not been included in the previous wave of research inside the SDA community, there is little data to compare to or to rely on for reference. The Valuegenesis Europe study has been carried out on an online convenience sample which, while large, has not been representative because of access and response control issues, but its results could have provided a basis for ulterior projects. Unfortunately, data on this study is not accessible.

**EUD Family Research** has been one other European study carried out during 2013-2015, on a representative 2062 sample of adult SDA members from all EUD Unions except the Austrian one. It used 2009 Adventist Family Survey translated and adapted for European population and focused on the following themes: family history, decision-making, parenting and education, sources of conflict, attitudes in the family: jealousy, fidelity, acceptance and patience etc., family-church relationship. The research results have revealed a high level of satisfaction within the marriage (67.19% are happy and very happy) that reflects in the high frequency of positive behaviors and attitudes like: spouse is understanding with partner (81.35%), spouse is loyal to marriage (89.71%), spouse is willing to work through problems (88.33%), spouse is warm and affectionate (84.66%). One of the main issues of concern, as reflected in the research results is connected to children's education. Less than 50% of the participants view a college education as necessary for their children. Yet, most parents who have expressed their opinion (1761= 67.7% of the sample) favor Adventist schools. Only 19.42% consider public schools to be a better academic option. Family worship and Sabbath activities represent another area of concern. Except for church attendance (96.07%), preparation (73.85%) and wearing Sabbath clothes (72.26%), the other activities, especially those involving volunteering for the ones in need, community service and activities planned especially for children are infrequent.

## 1.7 Objectives

The research study has aimed to identify the tendencies and progress of the church members in the main faith and community-related behaviors and attitudes of the European SDA members. Since the equivalent study in 2013 has not been used for the global data



analysis, this research will serve as reference point for the follow up studies on the same topics.

The research objectives have been oriented towards the following:

- 1. To explore the faith-related beliefs of the SDA members of EUD (corresponding to Reach up with God portion of Reach the World 2015-2020);
- 2. To analyze the attitudes towards the church in general and the local communities (corresponding to Reach in with God portion of Reach the World 2015-2020);
- 3. To explore the mission and evangelism related attitudes and behaviors of EUD members (corresponding to Reach out with God portion of Reach the World 2015-2020);
- 4. To investigate the habits and lifestyle choices of the SDA members of EUD that are relevant for their religious and spiritual life;
- 5. To identify common trends and differences among the culturally different areas of EUD regarding members' beliefs, attitudes and behaviors.

The process and application objectives have included:

- 1. Translation and cultural adaptation of the 2017 Church Member Survey into all languages of the 13 countries of EUD;
- 2. Selecting and reaching a representative sample for the entire Division and each participating Union / Conference;
- Training of a group of data gathering supervisors who will have the skills to work on other research projects involving quantitative research methods organized by EUD or ASTR;
- 4. Data analysis for the both EUD and participating Unions.

The development and implementation objectives were as follows:

- 1. To ensure a better understanding of the beliefs, attitudes and
- To provide both EUD administration and ASTR with data and research result that will help develop strategic plans for specific objectives related to strengthening the spiritual life of church members, their support in problematic areas of their spiritual life, sustaining and improving their involvement in the local churches, mission and evangelism.



# Methodology

#### 1.8 Research Questions

The research questions to be answered by this study are:

- 1. What are the differences among EUD Unions regarding religious beliefs, attitudes and behaviors?
- 2. What are the differences among different age groups regarding the beliefs and practices of the Seventh Day Adventist faith?
- 3. What is the level of commitment to the SDA specific teachings?
- 4. What beliefs are most relevant for participants' religious experiences?
- 5. What are the most frequent religious habits embraced by the SDA members?
- 6. What are the relevant emotional and social experiences related to the local church?

### 1.9 Research Design

The research has followed a quantitative approach: operator assisted survey based on the translated and culturally adapted version of 2017 Church Member Survey.

The participants have used hard copies of the survey, which they completed assisted by survey operators. Data gathering supervisors have collected the surveys from their designated area before sending them to the research team. The document detailing the instructions for data gathering supervisors is included in Appendix no. 1.

The research team has selected and trained several database operators proceeding to supervise the creation and maintenance of the database.

#### 1.10 Instruments

The research has used an omnibus survey, CMS 2017 Survey, translated and culturally adapted for all languages in EUD:

- French
- German
- Bulgarian
- Spanish
- Hungarian
- Romanian
- Italian
- Portuguese
- Czech

### 1.11 Sample

The research has been carried out on a representative sample of the EUD members from 10 out of its 11 constituent Unions. Due to organizational reasons (constituency meetings, change of teams), one of the Unions was not able to gather data in order to be included in the research.

The research sample has been selected through a sequential / cluster method, designed to be representative for the target population for age, gender, ethnic groups and other relevant



demographic variables. The number of participants to the study and the corresponding number of churches has been calculated based on a proportional layered model in order to ensure a better representativeness of the entire sample.

Each church has been considered a cluster in the sampling process while all clusters have been organized into 3 tiers:

• small: <50 members

medium sized: 51-200 members

• large: 200 + members

A proportional number of churches has been selected from each tier, keeping the number of participants proportional to the total membership in each tier. The number of participants has also been proportional for each Union's membership. The structure of the sample as recorded after the data gathering phase has been completed is presented in Table no. 1.

The response rate for CMS 2017 survey was 77.30% of the projected sample of 5000 participants, aged 14 to 97, with a mean age of 51.43. 54.2% of them were female, while 44.8% were male (missing data = 1%).

Graph no. 1: Distribution of participants' age




### 1.12 Data Collection

All data has been collected by pastors of the local churches under the supervision of the Secretary of each Union. All Secretaries have participated in a training session held February 21 - 23, 2017, then proceeded to supervise the data gathering in their respective Unions.



The survey translations have been printed and used upon need in each local church that has been selected to participate in the study. The local pastor for each church has distributed and collected the surveys.

The selection procedure (sequential cluster sampling) has been detailed and explained in a Guide for data gathering operators, included fully in Appendix no.1.

### 1.13 Data Analysis

The team of database operators has received all surveys and created the database by either input into Survey Monkey platform, or by SPSS.

All statistical analyses have been performed by the research team using SPSS. The data analysis has focused on descriptives for the entire sample and comparisons among relevant groups (Union samples and age groups).

#### 1.14 Limitations

The limitations of the study are related mainly to the size and heterogeneous nature of the sample:

- the large non-response rate due to the nature and size of the survey and to participants' lack of experience and motivation;
- the validity issues arising from the different variants of the survey and the different work styles of the survey operators and data gathering supervisors;
- issues arising from the language barrier and translation of the instrument, especially for ethnic minorities participating in their own communities;
- delays in data gathering for such a large sample distributed all across Inter-European Division, seconded by the constituency meetings in most Unions that lead to changes in the administration teams;
- the refusal or delay to participate from one or several of the Unions, which has impacted on the size and representativeness of the sample;
- little control over the way data gatherers have respected the instructions for selecting participants issued by the research team.




## Results

The statistical analysis of the data provided by the participants has been focused on a first level of describing the responses for all participants then breaking it down to significant groups (i.e. EUD Unions, age).

### 1.15 Personal Demographics

#### Q3. Do you have a disability or identify as a person who is deaf?

Of the 3477 participants who have answered this survey item, 552 (14.3% of the sample) declared having one or multiple forms of disability. The distribution of those forms of disability among participants is presented in Graph no 3.



Graph no. 3: Types of disability and their frequency among participants




## Q4. Are you currently or have you been in the past employed by the Seventh-day Adventist Church?

Of the 3673 participants who answered this question, 286 (7.4%) had been employed by the Adventist church in the past, 358 (9.3%) were employees of the SDA Church at the time of the research.

#### Q5. What is the highest level of school you have completed?

Questioned about their education, 1210 (31,80%) reported having completed a level of higher education (college, graduate school or higher).

Graph no. 5: Level of education across EUD Unions




## Q7. What is the total number of years that you have spent attending an Adventist school?

Of all the participants, 2486 (64.3%) never attended an Adventist school. 2.1% have spent 10 or more years in an Adventist institution.

There are significant differences among EUD Unions regarding the number of years spent in an Adventist school (F(9,2950)=22.686 p<0.01  $\eta p^2$ =.154). Post- hoc analyses using Bonferroni's Procedure indicated that the Romanian and the North German samples have spent significantly fewer years on average than most of the other samples, while the Italian and the Czecho-Slovakian samples reported significantly more years spent in Adventist schools (p<0.05).



Graph no. 6: No. of years spent attending Adventist schools – comparisons among EUD Unions





#### Q8. How many people live in your immediate household (including yourself)?


The household size in EUD varies between 1 and 22, with a median of 3 and a mean of 3.12 members residing together. The mode value for this item is 2, which, considering the age demographics, corresponds to a middle aged or elderly couple (with or without adult children).

Graph no. 8: Household size across EUD Unions






There are significant differences, although small, among EUD Unions regarding the number of people residing in the same home (F(9,3734)=14.51 p<0.01  $\eta$ p<sup>2</sup>=.034). Post- hoc analyses using Bonferroni's Procedure indicated that the Austrian, the South and the North German samples have reported significantly fewer members of the family residing together (p<0.05).

# Q9. How many people in your immediate household (including yourself) observe the Sabbath?

The number of people observing the Sabbath in participants' households varies between 1 and 22, with a median of 2 and a mean of 2.78.




Graph no. 9: No. of people observing the Sabbath in the household

There are significant differences, although small, among EUD Unions regarding the number of people in the household observing the Sabbath (F(9,3706)=13.14 p<0.01  $\eta p^2$ =.031). Post-hoc analyses using Bonferroni's Procedure indicated that the Austrian and Bulgarian samples have reported significantly fewer members observing the Sabbath, while the Portuguese, Czecho-Slovakian and Romanian samples have registered more members observing the Sabbath in the households (p<0.05).

Graph no. 11: Marital status




Graph no. 12: Marital status - distribution within each EUD Union




The distribution of marital status is not homogeneous across EUD Unions ( $\chi^2(45)$ =148.56 p<0.01). The Austrian, Bulgarian and Franco-Belgian Unions have the highest rates of divorce, while the Romanian sample reported the lowest rate. The Franco-Belgian Union has reported the largest percentage of single respondents, while the Bulgarian Union reported the lowest rate on this tier of marital status.



Graph no. 14: Number of children




There are few significant differences among EUD Unions regarding the number of children for each participant (F(9,2943)=2.43 p<0.01  $\eta p^2$ =.007). Post- hoc analyses using Bonferroni's Procedure indicated that the Bulgarian sample reported having slightly less children than the Czecho-Slovakian one (p<0.05).

# Q13. How many of your children are still being raised in the Seventh-day Adventist church or are members of the Seventh-day Adventist church?

The number of children who, at the time of the survey, were SDA members or being raised SDA ranged from 0 to 31. The median value was 2, while the mean was 1.99, a significantly lower number compared to the number of children reported above (t(2329)=17.69 p<0.01).

There are significant differences among EUD Unions regarding the number of children members of the SDA Church or being raised in the SDA church (F(9,2334)=3.41 p<0.01  $\eta p^2$ =.013). Post- hoc analyses using Bonferroni's Procedure indicated that the Bulgarian sample reported having less children members of the SDA Church or being raised in the SDA church then the Czecho-Slovakian, the Franco-Belgian, the North German and the South German Unions.


The vast majority of the respondents (95.8%) have declared themselves Seventh-day Adventists.

#### Q15. Year of baptism



Graph no. 16: Year of baptism




Graph no. 17: Year of baptism for the Bulgarian Sample






Graph no. 18: Year of baptism for the Czecho-Slovakian Sample




Graph no. 19: Year of baptism for the Romanian Sample


Graph no. 20: Age at baptism

Graph no. 21: Mean age at baptism for EUD Unions




Most of the participants has had a connection to the church since childhood, either by being raised as a SDA and keeping connected with the church (41.95%), or by returning after being raised in the church and having left (5.68%) or by joining with the family (7.71%). Graph no. 23: Personal history with the SDA Church - distribution among Unions






#### Q 17. What history does your family have with the Seventh-day Adventist Church?

35.9% of the participants report being the first generation of Adventists in their families while 34.0% have at least a parent who is a Seventh Day Adventist. 31.2% of the respondents have at least on grandparent who is a Seventh Day Adventist, while 14.7% can claim being related to Seventh Day Adventists at the fourth generation (grandparents) and 9.6% at the fifth generation and more.

There are significant differences among EUD Unions regarding the proportion of first generation vs. second (or more) generation of Adventists ( $\chi^2(9)$ =147.20 p<0.01). The Bulgarian Union registers the smallest percentage of first generation Adventists, while the Swiss, South German and North German Unions report the largest percentages of the same category.

Graph no. 24: Percentage of first generation vs second (or more) generation Adventists in EUD Unions










Graph no. 26: Church attendance in the local church


Graph no. 27: Local church size







Graph no. 29: Local church location in relation to Adventist institutions







Graph no. 30: Childhood family experiences







Graph no. 31: Closeness to parents – percentage of participants who agree with the statement across Unions






Graph no. 32: Family involved in community service – percentage of participants who agree with the statement across Unions




Graph no. 33: Discussions on religious topics – percentage of participants who agree with the statement across Unions






Graph no. 34: Bible reading as a habit in the family – percentage of participants who agree with the statement across Unions




Graph no. 35: Prayer before meals – percentage of participants who agree with the statement across Unions






Graph no. 36: Morning or evening worship – percentage of participants who agree with the statement across Unions




Graph no. 37: Parents attended church regularly – percentage of participants who agree with the statement across Unions





Graph no. 38: Importance of Adventist education in the family – percentage of participants who agree with the statement across Unions







Graph no. 39: Importance of Adventist education in the family – percentage of participants who agree with the statement across age groups




Graph no. 40: Being able to talk with parents about religion – percentage of participants who agree with the statement across age groups






Graph no. 41: Bible reading in the family – percentage of participants who agree with the statement across age groups




Graph no. 42: Family involvement in community service – percentage of participants who agree with the statement across age groups






Graph no. 43: Prayer before meals in the family – percentage of participants who agree with the statement across age groups




Graph no. 44: Morning and evening worship in the family – percentage of participants who agree with the statement across age groups






Graph no. 45: Parents attended church regularly– percentage of participants who agree with the statement across age groups



Graph no. 46: Importance of Adventist education in the family – percentage of participants who agree with the statement across age groups






#### Q 23. Which of the following best describes the family situation in which you grew up?




Graph no. 48: Decisions making regarding media usage during teenage years – comparison among EUD Unions

Graph no. 49: Decisions making regarding the time to sleep during teenage years – comparison among EUD Unions




Graph no. 50: Decisions making regarding the choice of friends during teenage years – comparison among EUD Unions


Graph no. 51: Decisions making regarding media usage during teenage years – comparison among age groups


Graph no. 52: Decisions making regarding the time to sleep during teenage years – comparison among age groups







Graph no. 55: Percentage of respondents across EUD Unions who attended church services almost weekly or more frequently




Graph no. 56: Percentage of respondents across EUD Unions who attended church services almost weekly or more frequently






Graph no. 57: Percentage of respondents across EUD Unions who attended a small groop organized by the local church almost weekly or more frequently




Graph no. 58: Percentage of respondents across EUD Unions who attended a prayer meeting almost weekly or more frequently






Graph no. 59: Percentage of respondents across EUD Unions who attended a public evangelistic meeting almost weekly or more frequently




Graph no. 60: Percentage of respondents across EUD Unions who attended a youth meeting almost weekly or more frequently






Graph no. 61: Percentage of respondents across EUD Unions who attended a Pathfinders meeting almost weekly or more frequently




Graph no. 62: Percentage of respondents across EUD Unions who participated in communion service almost weekly or more frequently






Graph no. 63: Percentage of respondents across EUD Unions who ate with members of the church almost weekly or more frequently




Graph no. 64: Percentage of respondents across EUD Unions who helped with a church ministry on Sabbath almost weekly or more frequently






Graph no. 65: Percentage of respondents across EUD Unions who helped with a church ministry almost weekly or more frequently




Graph no. 66: Percentage of respondents across EUD Unions who received a visit from the pastor almost weekly or more frequently






Graph no. 67: Percentage of respondents across EUD Unions who received a visit from a church elder almost weekly or more frequently




Graph no. 68: Percentage of respondents across EUD Unions who received a visit from a church member almost weekly or more frequently






Graph no. 69: Percentage of respondents across EUD Unions who witnessed to non-Adventists almost weekly or more frequently




Graph no. 70: Percentage of respondents across EUD Unions who spent time forming friendships with non-Adventists almost weekly or more frequently






Graph no. 71: Percentage of respondents across EUD Unions who spent time meeting the needs of non - Adventists almost weekly or more frequently



Graph no. 72: Percentage of respondents across EUD Unions who supported another church member to grow spiritually almost weekly or more frequently









Graph no. 73: Percentage of respondents in different age groups who attended church services almost weekly or more frequently




Graph no. 74: Percentage of respondents in different age groups who attended Sabbath School almost weekly or more frequently






Graph no. 75: Percentage of respondents in different age groups who attended a small group organized by the local church almost weekly or more frequently




Graph no. 76: Percentage of respondents in different age groups who attended a prayer meeting almost weekly or more frequently






Graph no. 77: Percentage of respondents in different age groups who attended a public evangelistic meeting almost weekly or more frequently




Graph no. 78: Percentage of respondents in different age groups who attended a youth meeting almost weekly or more frequently






Graph no. 79: Percentage of respondents in different age groups who attended a Pathfinders meeting almost weekly or more frequently




Graph no. 80: Percentage of respondents in different age groups who participated in communion service almost weekly or more frequently






Graph no. 81: Percentage of respondents in different age groups who ate with members of the church almost weekly or more frequently




Graph no. 82: Percentage of respondents in different age groups who helped with a church ministry almost weekly or more frequently






Graph no. 83: Percentage of respondents in different age groups who received a visit from the pastor almost weekly or more frequently




Graph no. 84: Percentage of respondents in different age groups who received a visit from a church elder almost weekly or more frequently






Graph no. 85: Percentage of respondents in different age groups who witnessed to non-Adventists almost weekly or more frequently




Graph no. 86: Percentage of respondents in different age groups who spent time forming friendships with non-Adventists almost weekly or more frequently






Graph no. 87: Percentage of respondents in different age groups who spent time meeting the needs of non - Adventists almost weekly or more frequently







Graph no. 90: Percentage of respondents across EUD Unions who Read the Bible more than once a week






Graph no. 91: Percentage of respondents across EUD Unions who study the Sabbath School lesson more than once a week




Graph no. 92: Percentage of respondents across EUD Unions who read the writings of Ellen G. White more than once a week






Graph no. 93: Percentage of respondents across EUD Unions who have worship with the family more than once a week




Graph no. 94: Percentage of respondents across EUD Unions who read religious writings by Adventist authors more than once a week






Graph no. 95: Percentage of respondents across EUD Unions who read religious writings by Christian authors more than once a week




Graph no. 96: Percentage of respondents across EUD Unions who read Adventist World magazine more than once a week






Graph no. 97: Percentage of respondents across EUD Unions who use the Adventist Review website more than once a week




Graph no. 98: Percentage of respondents across EUD Unions who read a magazine or newsletter for the local Union more than once a week






Graph no. 99: Percentage of respondents across EUD Unions who read or respond to Adventist social media more than once a week




Graph no. 100: Percentage of respondents across EUD Unions who read or respond to the Christian social media more than once a week






Graph no. 101: Percentage of respondents across EUD Unions who listen to an Adventist radio more than once a week




Graph no. 102: Percentage of respondents across EUD Unions who listen to other Radio broadcasts more than once a week






Graph no. 103: Percentage of respondents across EUD Unions who **Watch Hope channel** more than once a week




Graph no. 104: Percentage of respondents across EUD Unions who watch other Adventist television channels more than once a week






Graph no. 105: Percentage of respondents across EUD Unions who watch other Christian television programs more than once a week




Graph no. 106: Percentage of respondents across EUD Unions who use a mobile device for Bible study more than once a week






Graph no. 107: Percentage of respondents across EUD Unions who use a mobile device for reading Ellen G. White's writings more than once a week



Graph no. 108: Percentage of respondents across EUD Unions who spend time thinking about the life of Jesus more than once a week









Graph no. 109: Percentage of respondents within age groups who Read the Bible more than once a week




Graph no. 110: Percentage of respondents within age groups who study the Sabbath School lesson more than once a week






Graph no. 111: Percentage of respondents within age groups who read the writings of Ellen G. White more than once a week




Graph no. 112: Percentage of respondents within age groups who have worship with the family more than once a week






Graph no. 113: Percentage of respondents within age groups who read religious writings by Adventist authors more than once a week




Graph no. 114: Percentage of respondents within age groups who read religious writings by Christian authors more than once a week






Graph no. 115: Percentage of respondents within age groups who read Adventist World magazine more than once a week




Graph no. 116: Percentage of respondents within age groups who read a magazine or newsletter for the local Union more than once a week






Graph no. 117: Percentage of respondents within age groups who read or respond to Adventist social media more than once a week




Graph no. 118: Percentage of respondents within age groups who read or respond to othe Christian social media more than once a week






Graph no. 119: Percentage of respondents within age groups who listen to an Adventist radio more than once a week




Graph no. 120: Percentage of respondents within age groups who listen to other Radio broadcasts more than once a week






Graph no. 121: Percentage of respondents within age groups who watch Hope channel more than once a week




Graph no. 122: Percentage of respondents within age groups who watch other Adventist television channels more than once a week






Graph no. 123: Percentage of respondents within age groups who watch other Christian television programs more than once a week




Graph no. 124: Percentage of respondents within age groups who use a mobile device for Bible study more than once a week






Graph no. 125: Percentage of respondents within age groups who use a mobile device for reading Ellen G. White's writings more than once a week

Graph no. 127: Personal experiences within the local church - percentage of respondents who agree and strongly agree










Graph no. 128: Percentage of respondents within EUD Unions who agree with the statement: My Sabbath School teachers or leaders care about me.




Graph no. 129: Percentage of respondents within EUD Unions who agree with the statement: My pastor cares about me.






Graph no. 130: Percentage of respondents within EUD Unions who agree with the statement: Other people in my church care about me




Graph no. 131: Percentage of respondents within EUD Unions who agree with the statement: I feel proud of my church and its role and reputation in my community.






Graph no. 132: Percentage of respondents within EUD Unions who agree with the statement: I attend a church that plans activities for everyone in my family.






Graph no. 133: Percentage of respondents within EUD Unions who agree with the statement: It is important to me that my local church is part of a worldwide church.




Graph no. 134: Percentage of respondents within EUD Unions who agree with the statement: The pastor(s) and lay leaders in my church work together well as a team.






Graph no.135: Percentage of respondents within EUD Unions who agree with the statement: My pastor(s) are well qualified to lead my local church.




Graph no. 136: Percentage of respondents within EUD Unions who agree with the statement: My lay leaders are well qualified to lead my local church.






Graph no. 137: Percentage of respondents within EUD Unions who agree with the statement: Youth and young adults play an important role in decision-making in my local church.




Graph no. 138: Percentage of respondents within EUD Unions who agree with the statement: Youth and young adults are actively involved in carrying out the mission of my local church.






Graph no. 139: Percentage of respondents within EUD Unions who agree with the statement: My local church has a program for preparing young people to become leaders.




Graph no. 140: Percentage of respondents within EUD Unions who agree with the statement: My conference/mission has a program for preparing young people to become leaders.






Graph no. 141: Percentage of respondents within EUD Unions who agree with the statement: My union has a program for preparing young people to become leaders.




Graph no. 142: Percentage of respondents within EUD Unions who agree with the statement: I apply what I learn from the Bible to my daily life.






Graph no. 143: Percentage of respondents within EUD Unions who agree with the statement: I apply what I learn from SS lessons to my daily life.




Graph no. 144: Percentage of respondents within EUD Unions who agree with the statement: I apply what I learn from Ellen White's writings to my daily life.






Graph no. 145: Percentage of respondents within EUD Unions who agree with the statement: Although I am religious, it does not affect my daily life.








Graph no. 147: Percentage of respondents within EUD Unions who agree with the statement: My local church offers training on conflict resolution and reconciliation.







Graph no. 150: Percentage of respondents within age groups who agree with the statement: My Sabbath School teachers or leaders care about me.






Graph no. 151: Percentage of respondents within age groups who agree with the statement: My pastor cares about me.




Graph no. 152: Percentage of respondents within age groups who agree with the statement: Other people in my church care about me






Graph no. 153: Percentage of respondents within age groups who agree with the statement: I feel proud of my church and its role and reputation in my community.






Graph no. 154: Percentage of respondents within age groups who agree with the statement: I attend a church that plans activities for everyone in my family.




Graph no. 155: Percentage of respondents within age groups who agree with the statement: It is important to me that my local church is part of a worldwide church.






Graph no. 156: Percentage of respondents within age groups who agree with the statement: The pastor(s) and lay leaders in my church work together well as a team.




Graph no. 157: Percentage of respondents within age groups who agree with the statement: My pastor(s) are well qualified to lead my local church.






Graph no. 158: Percentage of respondents within age groups who agree with the statement: My lay leaders are well qualified to lead my local church.




Graph no. 159: Percentage of respondents within age groups who agree with the statement: Youth and young adults play an important role in decision-making in my local church.






Graph no. 160: Percentage of respondents within age groups who agree with the statement: My local church has a program for preparing young people to become leaders.




Graph no. 161: Percentage of respondents within age groups who agree with the statement: My conference/mission has a program for preparing young people to become leaders.






Graph no. 162: Percentage of respondents within age groups who agree with the statement: My union has a program for preparing young people to become leaders.




Graph no. 163: Percentage of respondents within age groups who agree with the statement: I apply what I learn from the Bible to my daily life.






Graph no. 164: Percentage of respondents within age groups who agree with the statement: I apply what I learn from SS lessons to my daily life.




Graph no. 165: Percentage of respondents within age groups who agree with the statement: I apply what I learn from Ellen White's writings to my daily life.






Graph no. 166: Percentage of respondents within age groups who agree with the statement: Although I am religious, it does not affect my daily life.




Graph no. 167: Percentage of respondents within age groups who agree with the statement: My local church has the ability to communicate across cultures, clans, ethnic groups, and religion.






Graph no. 168: Percentage of respondents within age groups who agree with the statement: My local church offers training on conflict resolution and reconciliation.




Graph no. 169: Percentage of respondents within age groups who agree with the statement: My local church offers training on nurture and discipling of church members.







Graph no. 171: Accessibility of Ellen G. White writings in native language - percentages






Graph no. 172: Accessibility of Ellen G. White writings in native language across EUD Unionspercentages





Graph no. 173: Sermon topics – percentage of participants who report having heard their pastor preach them often and very often






Graph no. 174: Sermon topics – percentage of participants within EUD Unions who report having heard their pastor preach them often and very often








Graph no. 176: Level of commitment to Jesus Christ – comparison across EUD Unions





Graph no. 178: The need for overall evangelistic efforts by the local church – comparison among age groups






Graph no. 179: The need for personal involvement in evangelistic outreach – comparison among age groups




Graph no. 180: The need for overall efforts by the local church to meet the needs of the local community.— comparison among age groups






Graph no. 181: The need for personal involvement in efforts to meet the needs of the local community – comparison among age groups




Graph no. 182: The need for overall caring for and nurturing members – comparison among age groups






Graph no. 183: The need for personal involvement in caring for and nurturing local church members – comparison among age groups




Graph no. 184: The need for overall reclaiming of former members by the local church – comparison among age groups






Graph no. 185: The need for personal involvement in reclaiming of former church members – comparison among age groups




Graph no. 186: The need for efforts by the local church to provide day care for children from the local community - comparison among age groups






Graph no. 187: The need for overall evangelistic efforts by the local church – comparison among EUD Unions




Graph no. 188: The need for personal involvement in evangelistic outreach – comparison among EUD Unions






Graph no. 189: The need for overall efforts by the local church to meet the needs of the local community.— comparison among EUD Unions




Graph no. 190: The need for personal involvement in efforts to meet the needs of the local community – comparison among EUD Unions






Graph no. 191: The need for overall caring for and nurturing members – comparison among EUD Unions




Graph no. 192: The need for personal involvement in caring for and nurturing local church members – comparison among EUD Unions






Graph no. 193: The need for overall reclaiming of former members by the local church – comparison among EUD Unions




Graph no. 194: The need for personal involvement in reclaiming of former church members – comparison among EUD Unions





Graph no. 196: Differences among EUD Union samples regarding evaluation of the following emotional experience: I feel free to be who I am






Graph no. 197: Differences among EUD Union samples regarding evaluation of the following emotional experience: I am able to use my spiritual gifts




Graph no. 198: Differences among EUD Union samples regarding evaluation of the following emotional experience: I feel loved and cared about






Graph no. 199: Differences among EUD Union samples regarding evaluation of the following emotional experience: I often feel inadequate or incompetent




Graph no. 200: Differences among EUD Union samples regarding evaluation of the following emotional experience: I feel loved and cared about.






Graph no. 201: Differences among EUD Union samples regarding evaluation of the following emotional experience: I have a say in what happens, and I can voice my opinion




Graph no. 202: Differences among EUD Union samples regarding evaluation of the following emotional experience: I often feel a lot of distance in my relationships with other people






Graph no. 203: Differences among EUD Union samples regarding evaluation of the following emotional experience: I am able to help and serve other people in important ways






Graph no. 206: Differences among age groups regarding evaluation of the following emotional experience: I feel free to be who I am




Graph no. 207: Differences among age groups regarding evaluation of the following emotional experience: I am able to use my spiritual gifts






Graph no. 208: Differences among age groups regarding evaluation of the following emotional experience: I feel loved and cared about




Graph no. 209: Differences among age groups regarding evaluation of the following emotional experience: I often feel inadequate or incompetent






Graph no. 210: Differences among age groups regarding evaluation of the following emotional experience: I have a say in what happens, and I can voice my opinion




Graph no. 211: Differences among age groups regarding evaluation of the following emotional experience: I am able to help and serve other people in important ways






Graph no. 212: Differences among age groups regarding evaluation of the following emotional experience: I feel a lot of closeness and unity



Graph no. 213: Differences among age groups regarding evaluation of the following emotional experience: I feel pressured to behave certain ways




Graph no. 214: Comparison among EUD Union samples regarding satisfaction with local church

Graph no. 215: Comparison among age groups regarding satisfaction with local church






Graph no. 216: Comparison among EUD Union samples regarding the likelihood to be a Seventh Day Adventist for the rest of their life





Graph no. 218: Comparison among EUD Union samples regarding the following personality trait: I help others with their religious questions and struggles.






Graph no. 219: Comparison among EUD Union samples regarding the following personality trait: I feel a deep sense of responsibility for reducing pain and suffering in the world.




Graph no. 220: Comparison among EUD Union samples regarding the following personality trait: I give a significant amount of time to help other people.






Graph no. 221: Comparison among EUD Union samples regarding the following personality trait: I give a significant amount of money to help other people.




Graph no. 222: Comparison among EUD Union samples regarding the following personality trait: I show that I care a great deal about reducing poverty in society.






Graph no. 225: Comparison among age groups regarding the following personality trait: I help others with their religious questions and struggles.






Graph no. 226: Comparison among age groups regarding the following personality trait: I feel a deep sense of responsibility for reducing pain and suffering in the world.




Graph no. 227: Comparison among age groups regarding the following personality trait: I give a significant amount of time to help other people.






Graph no. 228: Comparison among age groups regarding the following personality trait: I give a significant amount of money to help other people.




Graph no. 229: Comparison among age groups regarding the following personality trait: I show that I care a great deal about reducing poverty in society.






Graph no. 230: Comparison among age groups regarding the following personality trait: I apply my faith to political and social issues.










Graph no. 235: Comparison among EUD Union samples regarding the following Sabbath keeping experience: If I didn't keep the Sabbath, I would get a lot more done.






Graph no. 236: Comparison among EUD Union samples regarding the following Sabbath keeping experience: Keeping the Sabbath helps me understand what is important to me.






Graph no. 240: Comparison among age groups regarding the following Sabbath keeping experience: Keeping the Sabbath is part of who I am, not something that I do because I have to.






Graph no. 241: Comparison among age groups regarding the following Sabbath keeping experience: If I didn't keep the Sabbath, I would get a lot more done.




Graph no. 242: Comparison among age groups regarding the following Sabbath keeping experience: Keeping the Sabbath helps me understand what is important to me.






Graph no. 243: Comparison among age groups regarding the following Sabbath keeping experience: I apply what I learn on Sabbath to how I live the rest of the week.





Graph no. 245: Overall level of happiness





Graph no. 247: Level of happiness - comparison among age groups






Graph no. 248: Life satisfaction – comparison among EUD Samples





Graph no. 250: Comparison among EUD Union samples regarding the following spiritual growth assessment: Because of spiritual changes I've been through I've changed my priorities.




Graph no. 251: Comparison among EUD Union samples regarding the following spiritual growth assessment: I more often have a sense of gratitude.






Graph no. 252: Comparison among EUD Union samples regarding the following spiritual growth assessment: I spend more time thinking about spiritual questions.




Graph no. 253: Comparison among EUD Union samples regarding the following spiritual growth assessment: In some ways I think I am spiritually lost.






Graph no. 256: Comparison among age groups regarding the following spiritual growth assessment: I have grown spiritually.






Graph no. 257: Comparison among age groups regarding the following spiritual growth assessment: Because of spiritual changes I've been through I've changed my priorities.




Graph no. 258: Comparison among age groups regarding the following spiritual growth assessment: I more often have a sense of gratitude.






Graph no. 259: Comparison among age groups regarding the following spiritual growth assessment: I spend more time thinking about spiritual questions.




Graph no. 260: Comparison among age groups regarding the following spiritual growth assessment: In some ways I think I am spiritually lost.






Graph no. 261: Comparison among age groups regarding the following spiritual growth assessment: My faith has been shaken and I am not sure what I believe




Graph no. 262: Comparison among age groups regarding the following spiritual growth assessment: I feel I've lost some important spiritual meaning that I had before



Graph no. 265: Participants' beliefs regarding the statement: If I am to be saved, I need to be baptized into the Seventh-day Adventist church.













Graph no. 267: Differences among EUD Union samples regarding the following belief: The soul is a separate, spiritual part of a person that lives on after death.




Graph no. 268: Differences among EUD Union samples regarding the following belief: Salvation is through Jesus Christ alone.






Graph no. 269: Differences among EUD Union samples regarding the following belief: I believe God created our world in six days of 24 hours each in the relatively recent past.








Graph no. 271: Differences among EUD Union samples regarding the following belief: I will not get to heaven unless I obey God's law perfectly.








Graph no. 273: Differences among EUD Union samples regarding the following belief: Fulfillment of prophecy and events in the world indicate that Christ's coming is very near.




Graph no. 274: Differences among EUD Union samples regarding the following belief: Christians may go to witch doctors or spiritual healers for protection or healing.






Graph no. 275: Differences among EUD Union samples regarding the following belief: When people die, their bodily remains decay and they have no consciousness or activity until they are resurrected.




Graph no. 276: Differences among EUD Union samples regarding the following belief: God wants me to take care of my body by avoiding alcohol, drugs, and tobacco.






Graph no. 277: Differences among EUD Union samples regarding the following belief: The head of the Church is Christ.




Graph no. 278: Differences among EUD Union samples regarding the following belief: The true Sabbath is the seventh-day (Saturday).






Graph no. 279: Differences among EUD Union samples regarding the following belief: Ellen White's writings are the result of the spiritual gift of prophecy.




Graph no. 280: Differences among EUD Union samples regarding the following belief: I am saved the moment I believe and accept what Jesus has done for me.






Graph no. 281: Differences among EUD Union samples regarding the following belief: I believe God created the universe.




Graph no. 282: Differences among EUD Union samples regarding the following belief: People who have died believing in Christ are in heaven right now.






Graph no. 284: Differences among EUD Union samples regarding the following belief: If I am to be saved, I need to be baptized into the Seventh-day Adventist church.






Graph no. 285: Differences among EUD Union samples regarding the following belief: I am confident that Jesus Christ will return in my life time.




Graph no. 286: Differences among EUD Union samples regarding the following belief: Prayer in the name of Jesus is the only way to defeat evil powers and demonic spirits.






Graph no. 287: Differences among EUD Union samples regarding the following belief: The dead have powers to communicate with and influence the living.




Graph no. 288: Differences among EUD Union samples regarding the following belief: Every person is born with tendencies toward evil.






Graph no. 289: Differences among EUD Union samples regarding the following belief: My body is the temple of the Holy Spirit.




Graph no. 290: Differences among EUD Union samples regarding the following belief: Church unity means uniformity in more than doctrinal belief.






Graph no. 291: Differences among EUD Union samples regarding the following belief: Different regions of the world should be allowed to set their own policies in order to meet differing needs.




Graph no. 292: Differences among EUD Union samples regarding the following belief: The sanctuary doctrine is vital to Adventist theology.










Graph no. 298: Differences among age groups regarding the following belief: The soul is a separate, spiritual part of a person that lives on after death.




Graph no. 299: Differences among age groups regarding the following belief: Salvation is through Jesus Christ alone.






Graph no. 300: Differences among age groups regarding the following belief: I believe God created our world in six days of 24 hours each in the relatively recent past.








Graph no. 302: Differences among age groups regarding the following belief: I will not get to heaven unless I obey God's law perfectly.








Graph no. 304: Differences among age groups regarding the following belief: Fulfillment of prophecy and events in the world indicate that Christ's coming is very near.




Graph no. 305: Differences among age groups regarding the following belief: Christians may go to witch doctors or spiritual healers for protection or healing.






Graph no. 306: Differences among age groups regarding the following belief: When people die, their bodily remains decay and they have no consciousness or activity until they are resurrected.




Graph no. 307: Differences among age groups regarding the following belief: The head of the Church is Christ.






Graph no. 308: Differences among age groups regarding the following belief: Ellen White's writings are the result of the spiritual gift of prophecy.




Graph no. 309: Differences among age groups regarding the following belief: I am saved the moment I believe and accept what Jesus has done for me.






Graph no. 310: Differences among age groups regarding the following belief: I believe God created the universe.




Graph no. 311: Differences among age groups regarding the following belief: I am saved the moment I believe and accept what Jesus has done for me.






Graph no. 312: Differences among age groups regarding the following belief: People who have died believing in Christ are in heaven right now.




Graph no. 313: Differences among age groups regarding the following belief: All believers are called by God to serve each other without distinction of race, culture, education, nationality, gender, or wealth.






Graph no. 314: Differences among age groups regarding the following belief: If I am to be saved, I need to be baptized into the Seventh-day Adventist church.




Graph no. 315: Differences among age groups regarding the following belief: I am confident that Jesus Christ will return in my life time.






Graph no. 316: Differences among age groups regarding the following belief: Prayer in the name of Jesus is the only way to defeat evil powers and demonic spirits.




Graph no. 317: Differences among age groups regarding the following belief: The dead have powers to communicate with and influence the living.






Graph no. 318: Differences among age groups regarding the following belief: Every person is born with tendencies toward evil.




Graph no. 319: Differences among age groups regarding the following belief: My body is the temple of the Holy Spirit.






Graph no. 320: Differences among age groups regarding the following belief: The sanctuary doctrine is vital to Adventist theology.




Graph no. 321: Differences among age groups regarding the following belief: In order to reach people for Christ, we need to get to know them and their needs before we preach the Gospel to them.






Graph no. 322: Differences among age groups regarding the following belief: The Bible teaches that sexual intercourse should be exclusively reserved for marriage.



Graph no. 323: Differences among age groups regarding the following belief: The Bible teaches that marriage is a union between man and a woman.










Graph no. 325: Understanding of the writings of Ellen G White – comparison among EUD Unions






























Graph no. 342: Diet types across age groups






Graph no. 343: Use of alcohol across EUD Unions


Graph no. 344: Use of alcohol across age groups




Graph no. 345: Use of tobacco across EUD Unions


Graph no. 346: Use of tobacco across age groups








Graph no. 348: Opinions on the safety of using alcohol - comparison among EUD Unions












Graph no. 351: Differences among EUD Union samples regarding the level to which they follow the Adventist Health message

Graph no. 352: Differences among age groups regarding the level to which they follow the Adventist Health message












Graph no. 354: Participants' beliefs regarding the following teaching of the Adventist Health Message: Following the Health Message increases the probability that a person will live longer




Graph no. 355: Participants' beliefs regarding the following teaching of the Adventist Health Message: I can choose which parts of the Health Message to follow and which to ignore






Graph no. 356: Participants' beliefs regarding the following teaching of the Adventist Health Message: The Health Message has largely been supported by scientific discoveries.










Graph no. 363: Comparison among EUD Unions on beliefs regarding the following teaching of the Adventist Health Message: Following the health message ensures my salvation.







