




SDA KIDS, YOUTH & YOUNG ADULTS AROUND THE WORLD (DATA AS OF 2015, 2017 ASR)



WHAT TYPE OF PEOPLE DO YOU BELIEVE ARE MOST LIKELY TO LEAVE THE CHURCH? (PS)


What age group do you believe is most likely to leave the church? (PS)






AGE WHEN THEY STOPPED ATTENDING THE ADVENTIST CHURCH (F&IM)


When did you decide to leave the church? (15)






- I haven't found one I fit in



WHAT IS FOREMOST REASON YOU REMAIN A PART OF THIS CONGREGATION? (SAD: Q. 2.50)




3. MEANINGFUL WORSHIP EXPERIENCE AND ACTIVITIES AFTER


- 1. MEANINGFUL WORSHIP EXPERIENCE, GREAT ROLE IS PLAYED BY PERSONALITY OF THE PASTOR 64% AND RELEVANCE OF SERMONS 85% (21ST CCS)
- 2. THOSE WHO FOUND PREACHING AT CHURCH RELEVANT OR HELPFUL TO THEIR DAILY LIVES WERE MORE LIKELY TO WANT TO REMAIN ACTIVE IN THEIR FAITH THAN THOSE WHO DID NOT (v eu)
- 3. ACTIVITIES OUTSIDE OF WORSHIP SERVICE (42%) (21ST CCS)
- 4. INVOLVEMENT IN DIFFERENT TYPES OF ACTIVITIES, MORE SOCIAL AND RECREATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES (94%) (CSY, NAD)
- 5. MORE ENGAGING, CONSTRUCTIVE THINGS ON FRIDAY NIGHTS/SABBATH (CSY, NAD)
- **6.** PROGRAMS FOR KIDS AND YOUNG COUPLES



4. CHURCH CLIMATE

- EACH CONGREGATION HAS ITS UNIQUE ATMOSPHERE OR CHURCH CLIMATE
- TWO CRUCIAL COMPONENTS: CHURCH WARMTH AND THINKING CLIMATE
- WARM CLIMATE OF ACCEPTANCE
- NON-JUDGMENTAL CLIMATE
- SUPPORT IN THE TIMES OF CRISIS
- COMPASSION FOR HURTING
- SUCCESSFUL CONFLICT RESOLUTION
- THINKING CLIMATE (FRANK, OPEN, TRANSPARENT EXCHANGE OF VIEWS) (HCS, V EU)
- CHURCH WARMTH 58% (V EU)
- THINKING CLIMATE 41% (V EU)

MATURE SCALE FAITH

- SEARCH INSTITUTE FOR A NATIONAL STUDY OF ADULTS AND YOUNG PEOPLE IN SIX MAJOR PROTESTANT DENOMINATIONS (1988-1990) DEVELOPED MATURE SCALE FAITH
- IT IS NOT SIMPLY A SET OF RIGHT BELIEFS
- RATHER, IT IS A WAY OF LIFE, A SET OF PRIORITIES AND BEHAVIORS WHICH EVIDENCE THAT FAITH IS DEEP, VIBRANT, AND LIFE-CHANGING


VALUEGENESIS (V I, NAD)

- ullet The valuegenesis average was 54% on church warm climate, and that was considered unacceptably low.
- WHEN ADVENTIST YOUTH IN THE VALUEGENESIS STUDY WERE COMPARED
 WITH THE YOUNG PEOPLE OF FIVE MAINLINE PROTESTANT DENOMINATIONS
 ON THE SAME SCALE, THE ADVENTISTS AVERAGED LOWER AT EVERY GRADE
 LEVEL, ESPECIALLY IN THE UPPER GRADES.


CHURCH WARMTH (VI NAD; 5 Ys)

- IT FEELS WARM. 44%; 36%
- IT ACCEPTS PEOPLE WHO ARE DIFFERENT. 60%; 42%
- IT IS FRIENDLY. 61% 48% STRANGERS FEEL WELCOME. 49%; 39%
- THE AVERAGE FOR THE FOUR ITEMS WAS ONLY 41%.

THE CHURCH WARMTH SCALE (V EU)




WORSHIP EXPERIENCE AND THINKING CLIMATE (TC)/CHURCH WARMTH (CW) IN THE CHURCH (V EU)




MY SPIRITUAL NEEDS ARE MET IN THE CHURCH

(TOTAL SAMPLE V EU: YES=49%)





CHURCH CLIMATE — DECISIVE FACTOR FOR INTRINSIC RELIGION (V EU)

- AVERAGE VALUE WAS 4.02 WITH 5 BEING THE HIGHEST POINT POSSIBLE
- "THE HIGHER CHURCH WARMTH WAS PERCEIVED, THE HIGHER THE VALUE FOR INTRINSIC SCORED (UP TO 4.26)"
- IF CHURCH WARMTH WAS VERY LOW, A VERY AFFECTIONATE MOTHER COULD STILL MAKE UP FOR IT, SIGNIFICANTLY INCREASING INTRINSIC RELIGION SCORE (4.13)
- CHURCH WARMTH COMBINED WITH A GOOD FAMILY CLIMATE COULD CONSIDERABLY ENHANCE INTRINSIC RELIGION
- THE HIGHEST SCORE WAS ACHIEVED WHEN HIGH SCORE OF CHURCH CLIMATE WAS COMBINED WITH HIGHLY
 AFFECTIONATE MOTHER (4.48)
- IN FAMILY CIRCLES, OVERALL, A GOOD FAMILY CLIMATE AND AN AFFECTIONATE MOTHER ARE THE STRONGEST FAMILY FACTORS TO FOSTER INTRINSIC RELIGION
- CHURCH ATMOSPHERE MAY HAVE MORE CONSEQUENCES FOR THE SPIRITUAL DEVELOPMENT OF YOUTH THAN WE THOUGHT

THINKING CLIMATE (VINAD: 5 YS)

- I LEARN A LOT. 34%; 28%
- MOST MEMBERS WANT TO BE CHALLENGED TO THINK ABOUT RELIGIOUS ISSUES AND IDEAS. 35%; 30%
- IT CHALLENGES MY THINKING. 31%; 25%
- T ENCOURAGES ME TO ASK QUESTIONS. 28%; 23%
- IT EXPECTS PEOPLE TO LEARN AND THINK. 40%; 34%
- WITH ONLY AN AVERAGE OF 34% OF VALUEGENESIS RESPONDENTS WITH A GOOD THINKING CLIMATE THAT FOSTER THINKING, THE YOUNG PEOPLE IN THE YOUTH RETENTION 5^{TH} YEAR STUDY SCORED IT LOWER, WITH AN AVERAGE OF 28%
- YOUTH FROM THE FIVE MAINLINE PROTESTANT DENOMINATIONS AVERAGED HIGHER ON A THINKING CLIMATE IN THEIR CONGREGATIONS THAN DID YOUNG ADVENTISTS. IF YOUNG PEOPLE THINK POORLY OF THE THINKING CLIMATE OF THEIR CONGREGATIONS, THE CHURCH WILL LIKELY LOSE THEM


TO REMAIN ADVENTIST FOR THE NEXT 20 YEARS

(V EU)

- 8 TIMES MORE LIKELY IF PREACHING IS RELEVANT
- 5 TIMES MORE LIKELY IF SPIRITUAL NEEDS ARE MET IN THE CHURCH
- 2.6 TIMES MORE LIKELY IF THEY ARE IN A SUPPORTIVE AND HELPFUL CONGREGATION: THEY USE THEIR SPIRITUAL GIFTS AND ARE INVOLVED IN THE CHURCH MINISTRY

SUMMARY

- **► WE HAVE A PROBLEM WITH YOUTH RETENTION**
- THE PRIMARY REASON FOR PEOPLE LEAVING THE CHURCH IS NOT DOCTRINAL
- CLIMATE, ATMOSPHERE, RELATIONSHIPS, SUPPORT, AND WORSHIP IN THE LOCAL CHURCH ARE CRUCIAL
- WHAT IS HAPPENING IN PERSONAL AND SPIRITUAL LIVES OF YOUNG PEOPLE IS ALSO CRUCIAL
- THERE IS A NEED FOR EFFECTIVE SUPPORT AND FOLLOW-UP SYSTEMS IN THE LOCAL CHURCH
