

RESEARCH SOURCES

- *21st Century Connection Study (21st CCS)* – Douglas Jacobs (SAU) & team; 2012-2013; n=1,153 (SAU, PUC, OU); mean age=28; 77% 3^d, 4th, and 5th generations of SDAs; more than 50% were married
- *Church Member Survey, SAD, (SAD)* – Berndt Dietrich Wolter & team, 2013, (n=4,367), AY n=2,248: <15-20; 21-35 age groups
- *Hope Channel Student Survey (HCS)* – Duane McBride & team, 2012 (AU), n=453, 57% never married
- *Beyond Beliefs Study (BBs)* – Jan A. and Leanne Sigvarsten, Paul B. Petersen (AU), 2012, n=37, mean age 20, majority were single
- *Seventh-day Adventist Youth Advise Their Church (CSY, NAD)* – Roger L. Dudley, 2012 (ICM), n=1,215; 37% under 16; 33% - 16-19; 18% - 20-25; 12% - 26-30 years of age
- *Health and Lifestyle Survey (H SPD)* – Terry Butler, 2012, age groups: n=2,063 (11-18); n=192 (19-29 years of age)



- *Valuegenesis II, SPD (V SPD)* – Berry Gane, 2011, n=3,397 (at least one parent SDA n=1,359), age groups: 48% - 14 years old and younger, 46% - 15-17 years of age, 6% - 18 and older
- *Valuegenesis Europe (V EU)* – Manuela Casti and team, n=5,415, ages between 14-25
- *Survey of Former and Inactive Adventist Church Members (F&IM)* – Paul Richardson, Monte Sahlin & Petr Cincala, 2011-2013, n=over 925



AGE AT BAPTISM?

V EU: In UK, Finland, Denmark more than 13% were baptized before the age of 12

V SPD:

- 24% - at 12 or under (about 14% at 9 or under)
- 14% -- from 13-16 years of age



“I was baptize at the early age so I cannot overcome temptation.” (LS)




21ST CCS:

There is a significant correlation between a strong devotional life and acceptance of SDA doctrines and Adventist lifestyle


Is there a problem with the devotional life of young people?




DEVOTIONAL LIFE (21ST CCS)




IT IS IMPORTANT TO ME TO SPEND TIME IN PRIVATE THOUGHT AND PRAYER (SAD, Q. 3.55)




HOW OFTEN DO YOU READ THE BIBLE? (SAD, Q.3.71)




HOW OFTEN DO YOU HAVE PERSONAL DEVOTIONS? (SAD, Q.3.71)

21st CCS:


Overall, there is strong support for SDA doctrines by recent graduates

- 85% said that the Adventist beliefs give them hope and comfort
- 88% said that even if they disagree with church politics, they still believe in the doctrines




Agreement with Adventist Doctrines




SDA DOCTRINES (BBs)


- B. 11 – Growing in Christ (“spiritual welfare”)
- B. 15 – Baptism, early baptism – unforeseen consequences
- B. 24 – Heavenly Sanctuary – terrified of the investigative judgment (long explanation – 252 words)
- B. 25 – 2nd coming – fear (18%) of persecution and that relatives/friends will not make it
- B. 27– The Millennial and the End of Sin – “so what?”
- B. 28 – New Earth – mixed observations
- (Fears) meeting with ghosts – (19%)
- Trinity – challenging doctrine
- ✓ **How can each belief benefit them and be applied in their lives right now?**
- ✓ **Church needs to use relevant language and explanation of the doctrines that are less accepted by young people**




Personal involvement of the pastor in work with pathfinders and youth is very important


WHAT WOULD YOUTH APPRECIATE?

(GREAT IDEA OR SEEMS LIKE A GOOD IDEA) (CSY, NAD)

- More social and recreational opportunities (94%)
- More engaging, constructive things on Friday nights/Sabbath pm (89%)
- Youth mission trips overseas/in the country (88%)
- Prayer conferences and youth retreats for spiritual growth (sponsor them) (86%)
- Allow youth/young adults to take more church leadership positions (83%)
- More days when youth lead out in Sabbath worship services (81)
- More innovative, upbeat, interesting worship services (77%)
- Youth in charge of church web and social media services (75%)
- Allow youth/young adults to establish and direct their own ministries (71%)

A PERSON OF MATURE FAITH INTEGRATES INTO HIS/HER LIFE EIGHT CORE DIMENSIONS OF FAITH


1. Trusts in God's saving grace and believes firmly in the humanity and divinity of Jesus
2. Experiences a sense of personal well-being, security, and peace
3. Integrates faith and life, seeing work, family, social relationships, and political choices as part of one's religious life
4. Seeks spiritual growth through study, reflection, prayer, and discussion with others
5. Seeks to be part of a community of believers in which people give witness to their faith and support and nourish one another
6. Holds life-affirming values, including commitment to racial and gender equality
7. Advocates social and global change to bring about greater social justice
8. Serves humanity, consistently and passionately, through acts of love and justice

V I NAD: 22%
10 Ys: 9%



BBs:

- I am not a vegetarian
- I eat chicken, seafood, but not red meat
- I eat dairy, eggs, honey



V EU: Unclean meat:

- 61% said this was “never justified,”
- 24% said “sometimes” or “rarely justified,”
- 8% said “always/usually,”
- about 7% said “I don’t know.”



21st CCS:

- 45% did not accept or had major doubts about Adventist teaching on discouraging wearing of jewelry
- Only 62% of them said that drinking alcoholic beverages was “never” or “rarely” acceptable while another 18% reported that it was “sometimes” acceptable, and another 20% said that it was “usually” or “always” acceptable

BBs: B. 22– Christian Behavior: don’t connect the same way as older generations (simple dress, etc.)

V SPD: One should choose **not to:** (Strongly Agree or Moderately Agree)


- Use illegal drugs – 81%
- Drink alcohol – 63%
- Sex outside marriage – 60%
- Eat unclean meat – 39%
- Have drinks containing caffeine – 25%
- Dance – 16%

How often did you do the following during the last 12 months?

- Drank alcohol while alone or with friends (Never: 66%)
- Went to a party where kids your age were drinking alcohol (Never: 63%)
- Looked at sexually-explicit material (Never: 67%)

V EU: 87% also reported they never smoked tobacco in the last 12 months



PERSONAL RELATIONSHIP WITH JESUS CHRIST


(21ST CCS)

- 87% agree or strongly agree that God is actively working in their lives
- 76% have assurance that they will make it to heaven by God's grace
- But only **59%** agree or strongly agree that they have a vibrant personal relationship with God




MY CHURCH IS HELPING ME GROW CLOSER TO CHRIST

(SAD: Q. 2.17)





YOUR COMMITMENT TO JESUS CHRIST (SAD, Q.3.39)





PERCENTAGE AGREED WITH A STATEMENT:

H SPD:

- 66% of 11-18 year olds and 87% of 19-29 year-olds believe they would remain a church member for life
- Fewer young Adventists believe they will remain a church member for the rest of their lives

21st CCS:

- 77% of those with children or planning to have children plan to pass Adventist beliefs to them
- 93% - they will attend church with their kids
- 80% and above – will have family worship, attend SS and read Bible together



DUDLEY'S 10 YEARS STUDY

SDA Education vs Public Education:


- Factors: church membership vs non-membership; regular attendee vs irregular attendee; dropouts
- More years in SDA elementary school (1-8) and 1-2 years of SDA day academies
- “Those who attended Adventist academies and colleges were, for the most part, much more likely to remain faithful Adventists than those enrolled in secular schools” (R. Dudley)



LACK OF EFFECTIVE FOLLOW-UP SYSTEM: WHAT HAPPENED AFTER THEY LEFT?

MAJORITY WERE CONTACTED BY SOMEONE (71%) [LS])


ONLY 39% OF THOSE WHO LEFT AND 48% OF THOSE WHO RETURNED ANSWERED THE Q ON WHO CONTACTED THEM
